Dr. GAO had returned to the computer science office and refused to leave when a senior professor action of behalf of the computer science dept. asked him to.

_____ advised that he was sending members of his dept. to ask Dr. GAO to leave. They expected that there might be some trouble with Dr. GAO. If a further call came in they requested members to attend.

1150 Second call received from _____, Dr. GAO had refused to leave.

1154 At the computer science building, members of Parking and Security escorted myself and two Csts. to the office of Dr. GAO.

Dr. GAO's body language caused me to believe that he could become violent. I spoke with Dr. GAO. He moved away from me moving his back towards the far wall. His eyes seemed to be blank - no emotion and just staring. His body was ridged and both facial cheeks twitched. I tried to reason with him that the university didn't want him in the office. I explained that I thought it would be best if he left and dealt with things in a legal manner. He did not seem to want to cooperate, he appeared to me that further action would be of a physical manner. We were at a stale mate. Dr. GAO refused to leave, he had a grievance.

1156 To keep the peace I arrested Dr. GAO.

Dr. GAO made a call to two professors asking them that they sign his passport papers (application). I agreed to help him. I took him to the Math Building. The form was signed, he returned to my car and I took him to his auto in the parking arcade.

Dr. GAO was arrested at 1156 AM, once he finished with legal aid his further time with myself was based on helping him get the application signed.

Once it was apparent the peace would be kept no further action required.
