On August 11, 1992, Dr. Gao complained to the Commission that:

On July 2, 1992 at Vancouver, B.C., Dr. Gao was asked by University of British Columbia staff to relinquish his office keys as his teaching contract had expired. He refused to do so and the RCMP was summoned.

At approximately 11:30 a.m. on the same day, three unidentified members of the University of British Columbia RCMP Detachment, a female Corporal and two Constables, one male and one female, attended Dr. Gao's office. Without any preliminary conversation, the Corporal is reported to have placed her hand on Dr. Gao's shoulder and stated that he must surrender the office keys or he would be placed under arrest.

When he refused to surrender the keys, Dr. Gao was arrested and searched until the keys were located and removed from his pocket. He was handcuffed and taken to the University of British Columbia RCMP Detachment, where his personal belongings were removed and itemized, and he was placed in a cell. He was asked a number of questions which he believed were not justified, such as where he was born and where he had entered Canada.

Dr. Gao stated that as he is a Canadian citizen, he is not subject to deportation and the RCMP do not have the right to ask "threatening questions" which intimate that he could be deported. He described the tone of the questions as "racist." He was released without charges.

The complainant wishes to lodge a complaint concerning the conduct in the performance of duties against an unidentified Corporal and two unidentified Constables of the University of British Columbia RCMP Detachment for abuse of authority in that he was unnecessarily arrested, detained, and searched. In addition, he was asked a number of questions which he considered to be racist in tone.

This complaint was received by Lorraine J. Holland, a Commission Investigator for British Columbia and the Yukon.
