# UBC profs anxious after tenure fight turns violent

A Montreal professor who shot to death three of his colleagues this week was affected by the same "publish or perish" mentality behind two violent incidents involving University of B.C. professors in the last 18 months, says UBC Faculty Association president Bill Bruneau.

The RCMP forcibly removed a UBC professor from his office five days after his teaching contract ran out this summer, Bruneau said.

"He had to be dragged from his office," Bruneau said. "It was related to the level of pressure on the campus."

He declined to give further details.

Staff Sgt. Bern Jansen of the RCMP's university detachment confirmed that a former faculty member was held in police custody for a short time in early July after refusing to leave his office, though no criminal charges were laid. Jansen said there are many disputes over tenure — which amounts to a near guarantee of a job for life — at the university.

"Tenure issues are pretty big here," Jansen said. "But we've never had anything anywhere near as big as the Concordia event."

"There's a lot of personality issues that take place here — it's just like any other community."

Bruneau said the UBC incident is a consequence of the "excessively competitive" atmosphere in universities, and followed another last year when the RCMP removed a gesticulating, shouting, tenured professor from the faculty club.

"There are tremendous pressures on people in the academic community now — it's all related to the 'publish or perish' syndrome," Bruneau said.

On Monday, Concordia University engineering professor Valery Fabrikant allegedly shot and killed two other male engineering professors, including the president of the Concordia University faculty association. Of three others wounded, one died on Tuesday. According to one news report, Fabrikant was denied tenure.

In a letter of sympathy sent Tuesday to Concordia University faculty association vice-president June Charkelson, Bruneau said the event calls into question the very basis of civilized human relations.

"Once again, we must ask about underlying pressures in Canadian academic life, pressures that may help to explain these murders," he said in the letter.

"There are tremendous pressures on people in the academic community now — it's all related to the 'publish or perish' syndrome."

In an interview Tuesday, Bruneau said the Concordia shootings recalled the 1989 Ecole Polytechnique massacre, in which Marc Lepine fatally shot 14 women engineering students. The university incidents point to a larger social question: "People are terrified they are going to lose their jobs — it's a consequence of the 1980s, Reaganism and Thatcherism."
