Mr. Gao has continued to report working (always early) and though he is cooperative /

He and his mother continue to share a basement - one bedroom apartment. Other than reading, watching T.V. and going for walks, he is not involved in any other daily activities. We have advised him that we could arrange voluntary work that could utilize his computer skills (and possibly develop into an employment position) but he is not interested. He also has refused assistance from the probation employment counsellor. He will only consider employment requiring his doctorate degree expertise and he realizes that this will not likely occur in B.C. if an employer checks previous references from his employment at U.B.C.

Mr. Gao is presently requesting that he be returned to court for early termination of his three orders (Probation and two recognizances stating he no longer requires probation supervision or Mental Health Treatment). I told him that I would not support his request unless:

(1) He obtained a letter from /
Forensic Outpatient Clinic which advised the court that he no longer required treatment and/or medication.

(2) That he had to complete 6 months supervision of his three one year court orders.

I believe Mr. Gao is successful in controlling his compulsive/obsessive behaviour while attending appointments with Forensic and Probation,

He continues to report bi-weekly to Forensic Outpatient Clinic and weekly to his Probation Officer.
